Every student experiences biblically based instruction every day, prays together and worships together in weekly chapels in all levels of our school, from ELC to Upper School. We serve together by partnering with local non-profits in order to represent Christ to our community. We preach the word of God in all that we do. Middle School students are challenged to know scripture and apply it to their lives as students work to develop a Biblical worldview and an authentic relationship with Jesus.

Our community is made up of 45% African origin, 35% Caucasian, 12% bi-racial, 5% Hispanic, and 3% Asian. This diversity has also expanded with the growth of our current international exchange program. Middle school is a difficult to navigate, but the rich diversity of WSCS allows each student to find a place!

WE ARE ACADEMIC

We offer a wide variety of AP Courses and our graduates earn admission into competitive universities, often receiving significant scholarship money. According a recent Washington Post report, only 19% of students nationally receive college scholarships. while 63% of our graduates receive college scholarships to schools such as UNC Chapel Hill, NC State, High Point University, Duke University, College of Charleston, Wake Forest, University of Miami, and Liberty University to just name a few.

Our middle school helps students to develop strong academic practices to ensure their future success. .

More than two-thirds of our students participate in extra-curricular activities such as musical theatre, athletics and a variety of clubs. Our athletic programs are competitive and push our students athletically. In recent years our athletes have earned four state championships, several runner-up honors and a national recognition in basketball and soccer. Our arts program produces a full-scale musical performance yearly and our lower school students receive instruction in art, music and physical education weekly.

Middle school is a great time of exploration, identifying and cultivating passions.

Students in middle school and throughout the school are taught the importance of kindness as they interact with students from all walks of life. .

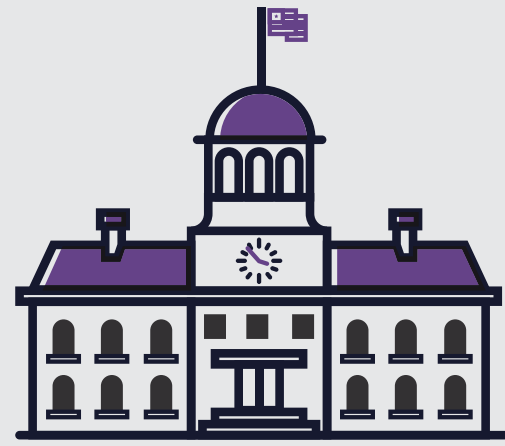

“Winston Salem Christian School changed my life forever and challenged me to grow in ways I never knew I could. I believe the teachers saw more in me than I ever realized. I was able to get early exposure to medicine through my internship and I was put in leadership positions that made me really mature. All my experiences at WSCS helped prepare me for my time at NC State.
